#### Christingle Service

A favourite with all ages, this service gets its name from the Christingle oranges which are used to explore the story of God's love for the world at Christmas. It's a truly magical moment when the candles are lit and the lights are dimmed, reminding us of that Light which no darkness can ultimately overcome.

#### Come & Sing Carols

Our Music on the Green December concert is given over to festive singing interspersed with prose and poetry - at times humorous, at times thought-provoking. This year will be no exception, so come along and get in the yuletide spirit with some of your favourite carols.

#### Festival of Lessons & Carols

For many, attending this traditional carol service heralds the start of Christmas. From the evocative opening notes of Once in Royal David's City, through time-honoured readings from the King James Bible, to the triumphant strains of Hark the Herald Angels Sing, this iconic blend of familiar Christmas carols and beautiful choral music is an event not to be missed.

#### Crib Service

This is our very popular child-friendly service and a great opportunity for little ones to come dressed as their favourite character from the Christmas story (wise man, shepherd, angel, etc). There will be

words and music as we assemble the crib and enter into the wonder of the nativity story. The service lasts about 50 minutes, so do come along - there's always room for one more angel or shepherd!

#### Christmas Eve 'Midnight Mass'

Experience the drama and beauty of Christmas at this traditional and atmospheric late-night service. There will be choral and organ music and well-known carols to usher us into Christmas Day through this celebration of Holy Communion. We promise that the church will be warm, and so will the welcome!

We pull out all the stops for this Christmas morning service of Holy Communion. With much-loved classic carols and the choir in full voice, we join together to celebrate how 'Love came down at Christmas' and what this means for us today. It's the perfect way to begin your festivities on this special day.



# gift-giving can be a reflection of the deepest truth about reality.

When the Three Wise Men handed over their offerings of gold, frankincense and myrrh to the infant Jesus, they started a trend of Christmas gift-giving which has proved extraordinarily popular.

And while some may decry the commercialisation of the festive season – and who could deny that a good deal of it has gotten way out of hand – I think we should be slow to condemn the impulse to give. After all, many of us are pretty self-absorbed much of the time! And so, having these weeks of the year when the focus is on thinking of others, and being generous towards them, can be a powerful counter-weight to self-preoccupation.

Besides, gift giving is very often the language of the emotionally inarticulate. Giving someone a thoughtful present enables the tongue-tied to express the things they find so difficult to say ... things like 'Thank you' or 'I love you' or 'I don't know what I would ever do without you?' I say this – you understand – as a man, and as a husband!

And most importantly of all, seasonal gift-giving can be a reflection of the Divine – a reflection of the deepest truth about reality. That, after all, is the heart of the Christmas message: the audacious claim that within, beneath and beyond all things there is an infinitely generous Love which delights in giving itself away; a Love which can be seen most clearly in the self-giving life of Jesus Christ; a Love which comes to us as pure gift and which – if we accept it – can transform our giving and our living too.

Pupils from Esher Church School, along with members of the Third Esher Scout group, crafted dozens of peace doves (from paper plates no less!) to remind us that 'blessed are the peacemakers' – a timely message for us all.



#### New ways of being 'Church'

When the world changed after the first 'lockdown' in March 2020, things changed at the Parish of Esher too. However, even when the pandemic temporarily closed the buildings, other means of being 'Church' opened up. New ways of gathering remotely, broadcasting services and staying in touch kept the bonds of community strong through the toughest of times. A particular priority was to reach out to those who might be feeling lonely or anxious, and so many volunteers sprung into action - shopping for the housebound, collecting medications, making phone calls, and generally keeping the lines of communication and support open.

#### New initiatives

New initiatives were started and continue even now that our churches are open once more. Sunday services from Christ Church are still broadcast every week, with access through YouTube and SoundCloud. This has proved very popular, with listeners and viewers both locally and globally racking up thousands of views. It also gives those curious about Church an opportunity to see what it's like without having to leave home!

Other technology also played its part, with Zoom used to the full for Book Group meetings, Bible studies, prayer Fellowship gatherings and family-friendly events. Many of these groups are now back meeting in person again.

#### Christmas boxes of love

Our Christmas shoebox appeal – with the charity 'Link to Hope' – gives a chance to bring a little festive joy to those living in desperately difficult circumstances in parts of Eastern Europe. Dozens and dozens of boxes filled with gifts and practical items were collected by church members, pupils at Esher Church School and Esher High School and some local Scouts. The boxes were blessed at the church service on Sunday 28 November before being sent on their way.



#### Supporting the local

Meeting local needs is a concern for any church community and the Parish of Esher does this in many ways. This year's Advent Appeal will raise funds for the Lower Green Community Centre, while October's Harvest Festival collected many boxes and bags of food for the East Elmbridge Food Bank. The 2021 Lent Appeal provided funds and secondhand laptops to help with school pupils' technology needs. Everyone is equally important.

#### Young people

We are proud to support our two local schools, Esher Church School and Esher High School in various ways, not least through the provision of regular Assemblies – online during 'lockdown' and now in-person – nurturing the faith of hundreds of students and their families.

#### Hitting the high notes

We have always been known for our music, so it is really wonderful to be back singing again on Sunday and hearing our excellent choir. But this is not the only string to our bow!

#### Music on the Green

Launched in 2012, Music on the Green (MOTG) began as a simple monthly organ recital and is now an established monthly lunchtime concert series. Held on the third Wednesday of every month, the light lunch offered has become almost as much of an attraction as the music itself! We regularly have audiences upwards of 50-60 each month.

MOTG now holds full-length weekend concerts two or three times a year, like the recent Beethoven 250th celebration. And for Holy Week, 'Music in the Tower', is our special presentation of chamber music with readings. This is held in Christ Church's Tower Room, a wonderfully intimate space with the best acoustics in the building! We look forward to the 2022 series after a lengthy Covid absence.

#### Looking ahead

As we get back on our feet, we eagerly anticipate our 10th anniversary concert on Wednesday 19 January 2022. Marking this occasion, Ensemble Pensiero, our new 'ensemble-in-residence', will perform one of the greatest chamber works of all time, Schubert's Trout Quintet. But to close out this year we have our bumper 'Come & Sing Carols' event on Wednesday 15 December. You will be very welcome.

#### Thank you for being a friend

Both churches remain an unquestionable and enduring presence in Esher. With no central funding, parishes maintain church buildings through voluntary donations. Without this generosity our parish would not function and our iconic buildings would fall into disrepair and close.
