THE COLLECT FOR THE DAY

Almighty Father. whose will is to restore all things in your beloved Son, the King of all: govern the hearts and minds of those in authority, and bring the families of the nations, divided and torn apart by the ravages of sin, to be subject to his just and gentle rule; who is alive and reigns with you, in the unity of the Holy Spirit, one God, now

and for ever. Amen.

READING Jonah 3.1-5, 10

The word of the Lord came to Jonah a second time, saying, 'Get up, go to Nineveh, that great city, and proclaim to it the message that I tell you. 'So Jonah set out and went to Nineveh, according to the word of the Lord. Now Nineveh was an exceedingly large city, a three days' walk across. Jonah began to go into the city, going a day's walk. And he cried out, 'Forty days more, and Nineveh shall be overthrown!' And the people of Nineveh believed God; they proclaimed a fast, and everyone, great and small, put on sackcloth.

When God saw what they did, how they turned from their evil ways, God changed his mind about the calamity that he had said he would bring upon them; and he did not do it.

PSALM 62.5-end

- 5 For God alone my soul waits in silence, for my hope is from him.
- 6 He alone is my rock and my salvation, my fortress; I shall not be shaken.
- 7 On God rests my deliverance and my honour; my mighty rock, my refuge is in God.
- 8 Trust in him at all times, O people; pour out your heart before him; God is a refuge for us. *Selah*
- 9 Those of low estate are but a breath, those of high estate are a delusion; in the balances they go up; they are together lighter than a breath.
- 10 Put no confidence in extortion, and set no vain hopes on robbery; if riches increase, do not set your heart on them.
 11 Once God has spoken; twice have I heard this: that power belongs to God, 12 and steadfast love belongs to you, O Lord. For you repay to all according to their work.

GOSPEL Mark 1.14-20

Now after John was arrested, Jesus came to Galilee, proclaiming the good news of God, and saying, 'The time is fulfilled, and the kingdom of God has come near: repent, and believe in the good news.' As Jesus passed along the Sea of Galilee, he saw Simon and his brother Andrew casting a net into the lake - for they were fishermen. And Jesus said to them, 'Follow me and I will make you fish for people.' And immediately they left their nets and followed him. As he went a little farther, he saw James son of Zebedee and his brother John, who were in their boat mending the nets. Immediately he called them: and they left their father Zebedee in the boat with the hired men, and followed him.

PARISH NOTICES

Remembrance Sunday - Remembrance Sunday this year falls on Armistice Day itself, 11 November, and commemorates the 100th anniversary of the end of the First World War. Our service starts with a short act of remembrance and a rededication of the relocated War Memorial on Esher Green, followed by the service in Christ Church.



Our Reader - Geoff Walker, served in the ranks from 1945 to 1948 in the illustrious 17th/21st Lancers, a regiment in the British Army. He was posted to Greece in late 1945, and then in 1946 to Palestine, where he served until 1948. Thank you Geoff.

Ringing Remembers - Our bellringers are supporting a national and international ringing celebration for the 100th anniversary of Armistice Day. Special muffled ringing will take place before the act of remembrance at the War Memorial, followed by open ringing at 12.30pm to commemorate the signing of the Armistice and again at 7.05pm, ringing out for peace, in celebration of the 'battle's over'. Many thanks to the bellringing team.

Poppy Appeal - There will be an opportunity for any who wish to do so to make a gift to the Royal British Legion's Poppy Appeal as you leave the church.

WWI Centenary Commemoration - Music on the Green is pleased to commemorate the 100th anniversary of the 1918 Armistice with the piano, clarinet and poetry of 'Wind & Words' on Wednesday 21 November in Christ Church. Many of the favourite songs that kept up the spirits of our 'Tommies' will be featured. The programme will combine popular early 20th century tunes, including ones by Ivor Novello and Jerome Kern, with moving poetry of that period by Kipling, Siegfried Sassoon and others, all woven into one continuous performance. We hope that this will be a fitting tribute to those who gave so much. Free entry and light lunch from 12.30pm. Concert from 1.10pm. Retiring collection.

Interregnum - The Parish of Esher is in a temporary period of being without a Rector, known as an Interregnum ('between reigns') or a Vacancy. The responsibility for the parish rests with the churchwardens, Sandra Argent and Beverley Eastwood-Taylor, and the PCC.
