Gloria in Excelsis

The Gloria may be used.

we worship you, we give you thanks,

**Lord Jesus Christ, only Son of the Father,
Lord God, Lamb of God,
you take away the sin of the world:
have mercy on us;
you are seated at the right hand of the Father:
receive our prayer.**

**For you alone are the Holy One,
you alone are the Lord,
you alone are the Most High, Jesus Christ,
with the Holy Spirit,
in the glory of God the Father.
Amen.**

A Harvest Prayer

Creator God, you made the goodness of the land,
the riches of the sea and the rhythm of the seasons;
as we thank you for the harvest, may we cherish
and respect this planet and its peoples,
through Jesus Christ our Lord.
Amen.

The Liturgy of the Word

Readings

*Either one or two readings from Scripture precede the Gospel reading.
At the end of each the reader may say:*

This is the word of the Lord.

Thanks be to God.

A hymn or psalm may be sung.

Gospel Reading

When the Gospel is announced the reader says:

Hear the Gospel of our Lord Jesus Christ according to N.

Glory to you, O Lord.

At the end:

This is the Gospel of the Lord.

Praise to you, O Christ.

A talk, sermon or homily will now follow.

Affirmation of Faith

Let us declare our faith in God:

**We believe in God the Father,
from whom every family
in heaven and on earth is named.**

**We believe in God the Son,
who lives in our hearts through faith,
and fills us with his love.**

**We believe in God the Holy Spirit
who strengthens us
with power from on high.**

**We believe in one God;
Father, Son and Holy Spirit.
Amen.**

Prayers of Intercession

The minister introduces the prayers.

In the power of the Spirit and in union with Christ,
let us pray to the Father.

Lord, in your mercy:
Hear our prayer.

Merciful Father,
**accept these prayers
for the sake of your Son,
our Saviour Jesus Christ.
Amen.**

The Peace

The minister introduces the Peace in these or similar words.

The harvest of the Spirit is love, joy, peace, patience, kindness,
goodness, faithfulness, gentleness and self-control.

The peace of the Lord be always with you.
And also with you.

Let us offer one another a sign of peace.

All may exchange a sign of peace.

The Liturgy of the Sacrament

Preparation of the Table

A hymn is sung.

With this bread that we bring

we shall remember Jesus.

With this wine that we bring

we shall remember Jesus.

Bread for his body, wine for his blood,
gifts from God to his table we bring.

We shall remember Jesus.

The Communion Prayer

The Lord is here.

His Spirit is with us.

Lift up your hearts.

We lift them to the Lord.

Let us give thanks to the Lord our God.

It is right to give thanks and praise.

It is right to praise you, Father,

Lord of all creation;

in your love you made us for yourself.

When we turned away you did not reject us,
but came to meet us in your Son.

**You embraced us as your children
and welcomed us to sit and eat with you.**

In Christ you shared our life
that we might live in him and he in us.

**He opened his arms of love upon the cross
and made for all the perfect sacrifice for sin.**

On the night he was betrayed,
at supper with his friends
he took bread, and gave you thanks;
he broke it and gave it to them, saying:
Take, eat; this is my body which is given for you;
do this in remembrance of me.

**Father, we do this in remembrance of him:
his body is the bread of life.**

At the end of supper, taking the cup of wine,
he gave you thanks, and said:
Drink this, all of you;
this is my blood of the new covenant,
which is shed for you and for many,
for the forgiveness of sins;
do this in remembrance of me.

**Father, we do this in remembrance of him:
his blood is shed for all.**

As we proclaim his death
and celebrate his rising in glory,
send your Holy Spirit
that this bread and this wine
may be to us the body and blood
of your dear Son.

**As we eat and drink these holy gifts
make us one in Christ, our risen Lord.**

With your whole Church throughout the world
we offer you this sacrifice of praise
and lift our voices to join the eternal song of heaven:

**Holy, holy, holy Lord,
God of power and might,
heaven and earth are full of your glory.
Hosanna in the highest.
Blessed is who comes in the name of the Lord.
Hosanna in the highest.**

The Lord's Prayer

As our Saviour taught us, so we pray:

**Our Father in heaven,
hallowed be your name,
your kingdom come,
your will be done,
on earth as in heaven.
Give us today our daily bread.
Forgive us our sins
as we forgive those who sin against us.
Lead us not into temptation
but deliver us from evil.
For the kingdom, the power, and the glory
are yours, now and for ever.
Amen.**

We break this bread

*All are invited to come forward to receive communion or a blessing.
During communion the choir will sing an anthem.*

After communion the children are invited to bring the harvest gifts to the altar, and the minister says:

Father, bless these gifts which we offer in your name.
May those who receive them know your love
and find a rich blessing.

Amen.

Prayer for the World

All now pray together:

We pray for those who are hungry or homeless,
for all for whom the harvest brings sadness and little joy.
For those who are lonely or helpless,
for those who are disappointed in life,
and their faith put to the test.

Lord, bless them in your love.

For those who are downtrodden or oppressed,
for those without power to negotiate or bargain.
For all who struggle for change, striving for justice.
For all who influence our thinking,
our buying and consuming.
for all who formulate policy and manage the markets.
For fairness and compassion in all walks of life.

Lord, bless them in your love.

Help us to be responsible stewards of your world,
to use it sparingly, and to take care of your creation
and for each other.

Lord, may your Kingdom come,
your will be done, on earth as it is in heaven.

Amen.
